Lilly is looking for her forever home

Meet Lilly. Lilly was hours away from being euthanized at an over-populated shelter when she and a few of her fellow inmates were rescued 6 months ago.

Our best guess is that Lilly is a Terrier/Chihuahua mix.



She loves to chase lizards and watch birds, but she's equally happy to sit next to you on the couch and watch Animal Planet. She weighs about 15 lbs. and I've had her spayed and vaccinated.

Like lots of shelter dogs, Lilly had some separation anxiety when she first came to me. And she wasn't properly skilled at meeting new dogs.

I am happy to say, however, her confidence has greatly increased as she's spent more and more time with my pack. They taught her it's no big deal when I leave the room, leave the house, etc.

Lilly would be fine as the only dog in her new home, although if she had a canine playmate, it should be a small dog like her. Lilly shouldn't live with cats or rabbits – her terrier/predatory instincts, while normal and certainly correctable, would be too much for the average dog owner to handle.

Lilly loves to ride in the car, and she walks exceptionally well on the leash, although proper on-leash introduction to other dogs is critical – she can get a little “protective” if her owner isn't calmly and correctly managing the meet-and-greet with a new dog.

Rather reserved on first meeting someone, Lilly quickly becomes comfortable, and will quickly attach herself to a new owner. She allows children and adults to pet her or pick her up, and will roll onto her back for belly rubs.

Lilly displays no food aggression to people or other dogs, although with a low growl she will let a dog know if it gets too close when she's chewing on a sparerib. A person can take food out of her mouth.

Lilly loves to please. She would be ideal for a retired but somewhat active person (able to go on leash walks), or a family with someone around most of the day.
